This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, extra-curricular provision and musical performances – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Music is taught in the music room every week and is informed by the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage (Expressive Arts), the National Curriculum for Music and suggested approaches of the Model Music Curriculum (singing, listening, composing, performance/instrumental performance). Lessons are a minimum of 40 minutes and are taught by a music specialist. Teaching is supported by specialist planning, and the GetSet4Music curriculum scheme of work. This musical learning is further supplemented by weekly a singing assembly for KS1 and KS2, lasting 20 minutes. Children in Year 3 and 4 spend a term learning ukulele as a whole-class ensemble. This is taught by the music teacher using the GetSet4Music scheme.

In the summer term of 2025, we held a music/D&T activity day where children designed and made their own musical instruments and used these as percussion to accompany recorded music. Some children composed their own music. This will be repeated every two years (next event in Summer 2027).

Part B: Extracurricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Roman Way Academy, we have a thriving choir which is free and accessible to Year 2 upwards.

Part C: Musical performances

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Children will have the opportunity to perform songs and ensembles this academic year.
