We have had a wonderful week at school this week. The children have been learning a little more about India which coincided with International Day. The children had lots of fun building the Taj Mahal out of blocks, experimenting with spice painting, making mandala paper plates and hanging elephant decorations. In Maths this week, we have been practicing comparing numbers. We have used blocks to create towers and have verbalised comparison sentences to explain which were more than or less than.

In Literacy, we have been learning about our capital and lowercase letters. We went outside and did a letter hunt to find the missing lower case and uppercase letters before pegging them up in the correct order. We have also been reading the book 'P is for Poppadoms'. It is an alphabet book which details different things all about India. The children wrote their own alphabet page by thinking of a special place or object in Royston.

In PE, we have begun practicing for Sports Day! The children have had lots of fun today getting used to the different activities and equipment we will be using in a couple of weeks' time. They can't wait to show off their skills to you all!
