

Year 2 Learning Overview Weeks 1st May – 12th May 2023

English	We are continuing to do some writing on the ' The snail and the whale ' book by Julia Donaldson. We are learning to identify the key features of a newspaper report and then write our own newspaper reports.
Maths	<p>Fractions: We are learning to recognise unit and non-unit fractions, recognise that a half is equivalent to two quarters and count in fractions up to a whole.</p> <p>Time: We will then learn to read o'clock, half-past, quarter past and quarter-to times on analogue clocks.</p>
Science	Living Things and their Habitats: We are learning to design and make a microhabitat where living things could survive and find out what animals eat to survive in their habitats.
PE	<p>Target Games: We are learning to select and apply the appropriate skill to a variety of target games and show an improvement on our personal best.</p> <p>Striking and Fielding Games: We will learn to track a rolling ball and collect it and develop accuracy in underarm throwing and consistency in catching when fielding a ball to a partner or a target.</p>
Computing	Spreadsheets: We are learning to use a spreadsheet to add amounts and create a table and a block graph.
Geography	Sun, Sea and Sandcastles: We are learning to describe the location of UK beaches on a map using the 4 compass points and compare the physical and human features found in Royston and a coastline.
Art	<p>Paint and Mixed Media: Life in colour</p> <p>We are learning to use paint to explore texture and pattern and then compose a collage, choosing and arranging materials for effect.</p>
RE	Showing care and concern: We are learning what rules are and why we have them and what makes people unique and how do people of faith show they belong to a religion.
PSHE	Relationships: We are learning to identify some of the things that cause conflict with our friends and understand that sometimes it is good to keep a secret and sometimes it is not good to keep a secret.
